Dear All,

With the weather we've had this year, harvest seems a long time ago. But harvest festivals take place this month, and are important.

Harvest Festival is a big thank you time: a time of year when for years, those who relied on local farming were thankful for the food that the earth provided and to God for taking care of them.

Today, for most of us, food comes already picked and packed from a supermarket or the delivery van, not our own fields – so perhaps it's even more important now to remember that our food comes from God's creation, and to thank God and everyone who harvests and prepares it for us.

Harvest is a great way to talk about thankfulness and to pray for farmers.

Do get involved this year and come along to the **Harvest service at St John's on Sunday 7<sup>th</sup> October at 11am**. All are welcome – young and old. Do get involved with our food collection – tinned and packer food which goes to help local families in need.

Lots of fruit and veg at the supermarket now has the name of the farmer printed on the container. You can put a sheet of paper up in your home, with "Thank you, God, for our food" at the top, and then you or your child can cut and stick the names of all the farmers onto the rest of the sheet every time you go shopping. When you eat, you can say, "thank you, God, and (all the names) for our food!" (And then finish by thanking those who cooked and will clean up the meal.)

Thanking God and those who make our food can help us remember to be grateful for the other good things in life. Maybe at bedtime you could have fun thinking of things to be grateful to God for – from the profound to the very silly!

Or maybe you can finish each day by thinking about all the people you met that day and thanking God for how they help you: the bin man who clears up your rubbish, the lady at the shop who helps you find what you need, the toddler group leaders who sing and cut up bananas, the young man on the bus who offered you his seat, the doctors looking after a family member

There's a lot to be thankful for every day.

# **REFLECTION**

## Mark 4:26-34 The Parable of the Growing Seed

26 Jesus went on to say, "The Kingdom of God is like this. A man scatters seed in his field. 27 He sleeps at night, is up and about during the day, and all the while the seeds are sprouting and growing. Yet he does not know how it happens. 28 The soil itself makes the plants grow and bear fruit; first the tender stalk appears, then the head, and finally the head full of grain. 29 When the grain is ripe, the man starts cutting it with his sickle, because harvest time has come.

## The Parable of the Mustard Seed

30 "What shall we say the Kingdom of God is like?" asked Jesus. "What parable shall we use to explain it? 31 It is like this. A man takes a mustard seed, the smallest seed in the world, and plants it in the ground. 32 After a while it grows up and becomes the biggest of all plants. It puts out such large branches that the birds come and make their nests in its shade."

33 Jesus preached his message to the people, using many other parables like these; he told them as much as they could understand. 34 He would not speak to them without using parables, but when he was alone with his disciples, he would explain everything to them.

#### COMMENTS ON THE GOSPEL

The Parables of Jesus are often stories which take time to tell, building up anticipation, raising questions as they unfold, bringing in different characters and emotions – *like The Good Samaritan or The Prodigal Son*. However, there are many which are little more than one-liners, perhaps told on particular circumstances, and although not lengthy often get to the point Jesus wanted to make.

These seemingly off-the-cuff comments on life raise a mood of eagerness and delight as they speak of the nature of the kingdom not as a remote event, but something we can experience everywhere, all around us, in events that may seem humdrum and commonplace. It is in the small things we often see incredible love, generosity, even miracles take place. Even something as small as a mustard seed or a wheat seed or an apple seed ... unseen at first, small and inconsequential, what they produce is so much more.

Our lives, the little things we do and say, and all those oft-forgotten seemingly inconsequential and unseen by others, can be the little thing that change someone's life.

Think on the little things you do remember which someone said or did which made a world of difference. Think then, on the little things you have done and do which brought light and love to someone just at the right moment.
